She has been an active member of WellSpring since 2006. She has assisted with parenting classes, Boys and Girls Club, and most recently PALS.</p> <p>PALS: Peer Assisted Learning Strategies Currently 130 children are enrolled in PALS between Ocean Park and Long Beach Elementary. PALS is an afterschool program. They feed the students dinner then have homework time, reading and writing with the help of volunteer reading coaches.</p> <p>The idea is to get kids excited about reading by creating a fun, creative environment for them. Children also get to take A.R. quizzes while in PALS.</p> <p>Summer programs will be available from June 27th through the middle of August, 8:45-3pm.</p>	<p>Jean is looking for additional volunteer reading coaches for the afterschool program.</p>
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<p>Presentation: Mario A. Rodriguez</p>	<p>Migrant Immigration Program Ocean Beach School District</p> <p>Mario has been involved with the Ocean beach School Districts Migrant Immigration Program since 2007. This program is designed for Spanish Speaking families that come and go with their industries season, like fishing and agricultural jobs.</p> <p>Every year Mario meets with students who need additional social and educational support services.</p> <p>Students have an opportunity to go to University of Washington campus and live there for one week. Students that go get .5 credits towards science.</p> <p>Mario also assists students in community integration. Helping get them their driver's license, enroll in services and learn the peninsula culture.</p>	<p>~ English language Learners meets on March 3rd where they will enjoy a potluck dinner, hear from local presenters and meet community members.</p>

This project materialized at The National Prevention Conference and YAK students have worked hard to bring the idea before the school board, administration, collect proper funding for materials and create policy. 	<p>First Mental Health First Aid Training is February 12th in North County.
