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<p>Mini Grant Presentations:</p>	<p>West End Pantry Located in Grays River, West End Pantry used their \$200 Mini Grant to put together weekend food bags for school aged children. They made 50 gallon sized bags filled with healthy on the go food options. 33 were handed out and the rest put into Christmas boxes. West End Pantry is open every Thursday 1-5pm at Grays River School.</p> <p>Peninsula Senior Activity Center The senior center is 100% non-governmentally funded. They provide educational opportunities, activities for all ages, meeting space, a full kitchen for events and exercise classes. The Mini Grant donation the senior center received went towards purchasing kitchen supplies to assist staff in continuing their events. The Peninsula Senior Activity Center provides \$5 lunches on Friday's and breakfast the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of the month.</p>
