Millage mini-grants for 2013 activities and events in the amounts of \$1,000- \$6-7,000 for DD/Mental Health were brought to attention. A discussion of budget and revision of the budget regarding disbursement of	

	<p>funds considered \$1,000 off from CADCA and Social Norms Materials. Also a change to Carry Forward (with a new request) and team funding of \$2,000. Adding \$4,000 to the Chinook Observer to carry forward was suggested. Ideas on the WellSpring Town Hall learning objectives were focused around the legalization of marijuana in the state in regards to the health risks (especially within the teenage brain) and how it may affect federal funding. Also discussed is whether the town hall meeting will focus on parents and/or youth and who will be the guest speaker is yet to be decided. Agreed topics for the Town Hall Meeting regarding marijuana use were advocacy issues, mobilizing the coalition, to address misinformation, and health aspects. A financial report was also presented for FPC/DFC. A change of budget was called for: Flint moved and Barbara seconded. Officer nominations for 2013 were: Past-Roseanne, Secretary- Geri, Historian- Sarah, and Treasurer – Wayne who also nominated Mary for office position. Gloria and Wayne were at large, and Eric for Chair Elect or Secretary. Adrienne and Michelle will be sending out team info sheets. A contract with Julie Soderburg will be executed too coordinate the Triple P program.</p>	
<p>Team Show and Tell</p>	<p>Adrienne Strehlow of the Peninsula Poverty Response Team talked about the team and the work they are doing, and what sorts of things are on their strategic plan. Adrienne also informed the group that Housing Authority money is currently available for those who are at risk of being homeless. Please look for an email from Katie with information on how to assist others with the Housing Authority paperwork. The team has a standing meeting time of 2 pm on the second Thursday of the month at St. Mary’s church. The Boys and Girls Club game night is Friday November 30th from 5:30- 7:30pm at the Boys and Girls Club located in the former high school building.</p>	

Youth Coalition Presentation	<p>Two students, Raven Rogers Sutherland and Monmolith Orzer presented an account of their White Water Wrestling Camp experience that was funded by a mini grant. They felt the experience was beneficial to their development and skills. They shared that while at camp they also had the opportunity to work as a team with others white water rafting. Rachel Lake, Ilwaco Music and Drama teacher, came to share an experience at a Band Camp that several students were able to attend due to a mini-grant. She said that although the camp was very educational, the youth were able to interact with others and do some team building. Sue Holt from the Friends of the Naselle Library presented photos to the group of youth interacting with some of the equipment they were able to enjoy that was purchased with a mini grant. She said that their library is a second home to some of their youth and they hope that with the new equipment more youth will spend time in the library instead of on the street.</p>
